THE NEPA CHECKLIST



Federal Communications Commission regulations (47 CFR 1.1307, et. seq.) require that owners of antenna structures

consider the potential environmental effects of construction and operation of communications structures and facilities prior to construction.

Many carriers will not consider collocating antennas on towers constructed after March 16, 2001 that have not been adequately evaluated in accordance with the FCC regulations. At a minimum, many carriers require a clearance letter from State and/or Tribal Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO or THPO) and a clearance letter from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service regarding federally protected species and migratory birds. THE 9 NEPA CHECKLIST ITEMS

Will the undertaking affect...

- 1 Officially Designated Wilderness Areas
- 2 Officially Designated Wildlife Preserves
- 3 Federally Threatened and Endangered Species and Candidate Species
- 4 Archeological and Historic Sites listed in <u>or eligible</u> for listing in the National Register of Historic Places
- 5 Indian Religious Sites
- 6 Floodplains

Will the undertaking involve...

- 7 Wetland Fill, Deforestation, Water Diversion (i.e., changes in surface features)
- 8 High Intensity Lights in Residential Neighborhoods
- 9 Excessive Radiofrequency Emissions

Evaluation of these resources is typically referred to as the NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act) Review process or simply, The NEPA Checklist.

In considering the NEPA items, it is important to remember that according to the FCC rules, a facility does not have to be physically located within an environmentally sensitive area to effect environmental or cultural resources. Therefore, adequate completion of the NEPA review typically requires expertise and professional experience in evaluation of environmental and cultural resource issues.
