Burial listings will be accepted. The Pineville Methodist Cemetery is one of the earliest surviving cemeteries in Monroe County. The earliest interment is a 2-year old boy, William L. Stallworth, in 1843. He is the son of H. P. Stallworth, one of the early settlers & prominent land owners in Pineville. It was not until 1865 when burials began to consistently occur. This coincides with the March 9, 1854 land conveyance from Samuel Dubose to a group of trustees to construct a house of worship for the members of the Episcopal Methodist Church South. Trustees included James Burgess, James M. Harrington, William B. Preston, A. C. Ramsey, & Duncan McKenzie; all early settlers of Pineville & founders of the Pineville Methodist Church. A number of early settlers, prominent land owners & families, and Confederate army veterans rest in the Pineville Methodist Cemetery. Of the earliest settlers to Pineville, Mark Parker Stallworth, Rebecca William Preston, Richard Dickinson, among others are buried in the Pineville Methodist Cemetery. Prominent families include Preston, Stallworth,

Despite the destruction of the church in 1910, interments in the cemetery remained steady through the 1980's. Since this time, the number of interments steadily declined until the most recent burial in 1998.

Harrington, and Steele. Two Confederate Army veterans are buried in the Pineville Methodist Cemetery: 1st Lieutenant John Burns of the 5th Alabama Infantry, and Private Robert L. Stallworth of the 8th Alabama Cavalry and Bradford's Scouts.

The Cemetery is one of the few surviving resources of the historic community of Pineville. Not only is it closely tied to one of the county's earliest Methodist churches, those that were buried in the cemetery have contributed to the development of the Pineville community and, later, to the nearby town of Beatrice. The burials span across critical periods of American & Southern history, including the Antebellum Period, Civil War, Reconstruction, Progressive Era, Depression, World Wars, etc.
